

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

Bob and Maripat Higgins have been members of LifeChoices[®] at Bethany for seven years. Bob is a retired financial consultant and Maripat is a retired infant teacher. Bob was a previous Bethany Life board member when he first learned about LifeChoices[®] and thought that it was perfect for them.
