From the President & CEO

It is my privilege to formally announce the launch of the Building Tomorrow initiative. After almost a year of study, deliberation and design work, the initiative to rebuild a significant portion of Bethany Manor has been approved by the Bethany Life Governance Board of Directors. Through their leadership, our viability and competitiveness will be assured. Our quality of service will continue to establish new benchmarks for all.

This decision was made knowing that the oldest part of our building, the "67 addition," was aging and needed significant renovations; unfortunately the structure cannot be brought up to today's building codes. Demolition and rebuilding is the only real option in making tomorrow a reality.

The design of the new structure calls for a new approach to resident centered care, best known as the "household" model of service. This model is personal, private, and home-like. It is a social model with opportunities for living within a family-like environment and not an institution.

The Building Tomorrow initiative is a \$16.5 million dollar investment, which includes 33,500 square feet of new construction and renovation of 23,500 existing square feet. It includes 20 private rooms designated for an extended care household, and an 18 bed rehabilitation and wellness center. The new construction will bring a library, community room, bistro, spa/salon, and wonderful outside spaces. The Building Tomorrow initiative also includes partial renovations to the units within the rest of the facility in bringing a "household" model to all of our residents. Projected completion date of the full project is April 2016. The transformation at 212 Lafayette will be the pride of our community.

The Building Tomorrow initiative is about ensuring that older adults and their families enjoy all that



home offers: directing their own lives, experiencing daily pleasures and continuing to live with meaning and purpose. It's about economic security for our employees and their families. It's about our community and our values.

I ask you to please join us as we move forward into tomorrow.






Transitional Care Q&A

From Kari Matheason, Vice President of Clinical Services and Outcomes



Transitional Care or Skilled Care has traditionally been a hospital or institution based care model. What we are finding in our work through transitioning to households in other areas of our organization is that while Transitional Care clientele is a very different clientele that want to get well and go home, the feeling of home while at Bethany Life helps aid in the healing process. Creating a new building that offers private dining spaces and small spaces to converse with family provides a less institutional and more home-like environment to heal. We're trying to mimic a typical home in the Transitional Care setting so those we serve have more confidence when returning home.



While the positive clinical outcomes are critical, we also need it to feel like home. Our staff is very highly technically trained - we have Registered Nurses on staff 24/7 trained in IV care, wound care, complex care after heart attack or stroke, tracheostomies, and more. But we have seen in organizations throughout the country that creating a home-like environment makes patients better prepared to return home after therapy, and no one else has that around here.



How will this positively impact our organization, our community, and the older adults we serve?

Equally as important as the positive clinical outcomes is patient experience. While we have put all of our focus toward providing excellent medical care and excellent medical outcomes, we also want the patient experience to be excellent.

Why is Transitional Care in general an important piece of our service to older adults?

Transitional Care is so important for our community – we want to help older adults thrive wherever they call home. It helps those we serve to get to their highest level of functioning after illness, injury, or surgery. We want to be there to help them get well and go home.

The feeling of home while at Bethany Life helps aid in the healing process.

Chef Chris's Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies

Makes 26 cookies Ingredients:

- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

- 2/3 cup room temperature butter
- 1 cup tightly packed brown sugar
- 1 cup unsalted canned pumpkin
- 2 large eggs at room temperature
- l teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2/3 cup miniature dark chocolate chips
- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper or lightly spray with cooking spray. Combine the whole wheat flour, all-purpose flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg into a bowl. Whisk to mix the ingredients together and set aside.
- 2. In a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, cream together the butter and brown sugar on medium speed for 3 minutes or until very light and smooth. Scrape down the bowl once to blend evenly. You may also mix the butter and brown sugar together by hand until it is very light and smooth.
- 3. On medium speed, or by hand, add the pumpkin, eggs, and vanilla extract and blend until well-combined (the mixture may appear curdled or broken, but this is okay), about 3 minutes. Scrape the bowl down once or twice to blend evenly.
- 4. On low speed, add the dry ingredients until just blended, about 2 minutes. Add the chocolate chips and continue to mix until they are evenly distributed in the batter, about 30 seconds.
- 5. Use 2 serving spoons to drop batter into mounds (about 2 tablespoons each), 2 inches apart onto the prepared baking sheets. Cookies will spread when they bake.


