Carmen Goebel, a Registered Nurse at Bethany Life, was approved by the Iowa Board of Nursing and selected by NCSBN to participate on the NCLEX* item development panel of subject matter experts that was held in Chicago, IL.

NCSBN, headquartered in Chicago, is responsible for developing and administering the NCLEX- RN° and NCLEX-PN° licensing exams.

Goebel was one of six nurses from across the nation to be selected for this assignment. She was nominated on the basis of clinical specialty and nursing expertise.

All nurses in the United States and its four U.S. territories must take the NCLEX°. The licensing exam identifies those candidates who demonstrate minimal competence to practice nursing at the entry level. Passing the NCLEX° exam is one of the requirements necessary for attaining a nursing license.

Carmen Goebel has served at Bethany Life in Story City since 2008. After earning her Bachelors of Science in Nursing at the University of Iowa, her 20-year nursing career has included the areas of Transplant, Trauma, Pediatrics, Surgery, Compliance and Geriatrics. Goebel currently works on the Transitional Care unit at Bethany Manor helping older adults get well and go home.

Fresh Salmon topped with Hawaiian-Style Sweet-and-Sour Roasted Pineapple and **Bell Peppers**

Ingredients:

- 1-1/2 cups coarse fresh bread crumbs or store-bought bread crumbs
- 2 Tbs. unsalted butter, melted
- Kosher salt
- 3 cups cubed fresh pineapple
- 1 medium red bell pepper, cubed (1 1/2 cups)
- 1 medium red onion, cut into thin wedges (1 1/2 cups)

- 1 Tbs. toasted sesame oil
- 1 Tbs. vegetable oil
- 1 Tbs. dark or light brown sugar
- 1 Tbs. sweetened coconut flakes. optional
- 1 Tbs. lime juice
- 6 (4 oz.) portions of salmon grilled or pan seared
- 3 cups rice

Directions:

Preheat oven to 400°F. Arrange pineapple cubes, red bell pepper cubes, and red onion wedges on ungreased rimmed baking sheet. Drizzle with toasted sesame oil and vegetable oil, sprinkle with brown sugar, and season with salt and pepper, if desired. Toss to coat.

Roast pineapple mixture on center oven rack 30 minutes, or until lightly browned, turning once. Remove from oven and sprinkle with sweetened coconut flakes, if using, then drizzle with lime juice. Remove to serving bowl and toss well to combine. Serve hot or at room temperature.


Serve Salmon atop a bed of Rice and top the salmon with the pineapple mixture.

language Margaret learned. Born in Stanhope, Iowa, Margaret moved to Story City when she was four years old with her parents and siblings. Margaret is the youngest of twelve children, nine sisters and three brothers. She has fond memories of her family life growing up. Margaret says "I always had a good time with my siblings. But we knew that work had to be done. Mama would always say, 'Things are much less to do when you do them right.' We always made sure to do our chores and then we could do whatever we wanted." Margaret still lives by these rules, keeping her room neat and tidy and making up her bed when she feels up to it.

Margaret has had an eventful life. She and her husband were part owners of a motel that still stands in Story City to this day. They also were owners of a funeral home and for a little while Margaret and her sister operated a dress shop. Margaret enjoyed each and every one of the businesses that she owned. She loved meeting new people and continues to be friends with many folks from her earlier days.

Margaret has two daughters who live in Colorado. Margaret's third daughter passed away when she was only thirteen months old. "She was special. She did not look like anyone else, but she had problems with her blood and sometimes that's just the ways those things go," she

says. Margaret's daughters both have children of their own and Margaret loves when her daughters and grandchildren come into town.

She says, "We own an apartment above the bank in town. So when they come they bring their air mattresses and we all stay there. We stay up, eat, and play cards. I always have so much fun."

At ninety-eight, Margaret does not have any one secret to staying healthy. Her mother lived to seventy-eight and her father lived to ninety. She says that her family was always healthy. There were no serious illnesses in her family. The real key to her health may be her happiness. Though her husband passed away in December of 1989, she has still been able to find joy through her family.

Margaret has been at Bethany Manor for several years and is enjoying her life. "The people here listen to you, they respect your needs, and when we ask for things they get them for you," she says. She takes pleasure in the many activities that Bethany Manor has to offer throughout the week and likes the fact that you have the option to attend. Her favorite activity is Bible Study with Chaplain Sandy. Margaret tells the story of Chaplain Sandy as an old friend of hers. "I met Sandy when she first came to town. She came in the church with her son in her arms and he was crying. I said, 'What is wrong with him?' and she told me that he wanted to keep his hat on in the church. I told her 'Let him keep it, it's his blanket.' And we have been friends ever since." Chaplain Sandy, along with other people who work at Bethany Life, has helped make Margaret's life comforting and pleasant. "I love Bethany Life and I enjoy seeing the change and growth of the facility." We love Margaret and wish her many more years of joy and happiness through her life journey.
